The Salem City Council met on Tuesday August 10, 2004 for a public hearing on Ordinance Amendment Chapter 10 & 10A and Ordinance Amendment Chapter 7. Vice Mayor Eddy called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**1. An Amendment To the Ordinance of Chapter 10 & 10A Vehicle and Traffic, Section 39; Operation of Bicycle and Play Vehicles, Subsection (A):**

- A. Ronnie Carder Mr. Carder asked if fines are included in the ordinance. As with many ordinances, Mr. Carder feels enforcement continues to be a problem. He feels the parking of vehicles on sidewalks needs enforced and does not feel this ordinance amendment needs to be enacted on all city streets.
- B. Becky Nesbitt Approves of ordinance amendment to restrict bicycles on sidewalks.
- C. Alvie Ford Mr. Ford also emphasized the need for better enforcement of the current ordinances.

**2. An Amendment to the Ordinance of Chapter 7 Streets, Alleyway and Sidewalks, Section 8: Obstruction of Sidewalk; Subsection (A):**

- A. Ronnie Carder Mr. Carder stressed the difficulty in enforcement of this amendment and feels parking by city and delivery vehicles on sidewalks are more of a problem.
- B. Becky Nesbitt Ms. Nesbitt feels the amendment should apply to primarily Main Street for bicycles and tricycles and automobiles and trucks and does not feel roller blades and skateboards are as much of a problem.
